# Moderns Department

- ▶ Consists of Core French, Extended French, Italian and Spanish
- ▶ Re-introducing Italian, beginning in grade 10
- ▶ All grade 9's must take French
- ▶ Extended French from grade 9 to 12
- ▶ Lots of activities and resources: music, games, videos, day trips to French restaurants, university campuses, French improv, March Break/June trip to France, Italy, Spain.

# Core vs. Extended French

## ► Core French:

- Some English spoken
- One course per *year*
- Open to any student
  
- Certificate upon graduation
- Offered in grades 9-12

## ► Extended French:

- No English spoken
- One course per *semester*
- Must be enrolled in elementary school (for Loyola - St. Christopher)
  
- Certificate upon graduation
- offered in grades 9-12

# Italian

- ▶ Will be introduced in September 2009
- ▶ Grade 10 Academic level
- ▶ Develop speaking, reading and writing skills
- ▶ Participate in Italian cultural activities
- ▶ Grade 11 and 12 will be phased in September 2010 and 2011

# Spanish

- ▶ Offered in Grade 10, 11 and 12
- ▶ Spanish becoming more common each year
- ▶ Excellent for business students - NAFTA
- ▶ Class project on a Spanish country in Central/South America
- ▶ Will be involved with Culturefest

# Gr 9 Core French - mandatory

## ► **FSF 1D Academic:**

- Further develop reading, writing and oral skills through studying relationships, social trends, careers, media, school
- Aim for functional language skills
- Short stories, articles and poems

## **FSF 1P Applied:**

- Further develop reading, writing and oral skills through media
- Use of a variety of activities such as songs, letters, cartoons, short stories to expand French skills

# Grade 10

- ▶ **FSF 2U – Core French:** (prerequisite FSF 1D)
  - Appreciate French culture in different countries (Central America, Asia, Europe)
  - Develop writing skills and examine other literary forms

## **LWI BD1 – Italian: (no prerequisite)**

- Introduces students to Italian language and culture, emphasis on speaking, reading and writing the basics

## ▪ **LWS BD1 - Spanish: (no prerequisite)**

- ▶ Introduce students to Spanish language and culture through variety of materials and themes

# Grade 11

► **FSF 3U**: variety of methods to promote reading, writing and oral skills:

- Understanding of French culture worldwide
- Read a French play, short stories
- Emphasis on Canadian authors
- Write a formal essay

**LWE 3C1**: further develop skills in Spanish language and culture:

- Study of art, music and traditions

# Grade 12

▶ **FSF 4U:** Further develop oral and written skills:

- Plays, culture, short stories, novels, media
- Emphasis on international authors
- Write a formal essay, in-class debate

**LWE DU1** – further develop oral and written skills:

- Engage in discussion and written expression
- Read a variety of materials, novels and plays

# Grade 9 Ext. French

## ► **FEF 1D – Semester 1:**

- Expand reading, writing and oral skills using discussions, debates and oral presentations
- 5 themes of interest: Sports, the world around us, the new millennium, French youth, and an adventure novel study.

**CGC 1DF – Géographie – Semester 2:** the same course as in Social Science – in French  
- study of Canadian geography, land forms, resources, human impact on environment

# Grade 10 Ext. French

## ► FEF 2U – Semester 1:

- Continue to develop reading, writing and oral skills in French
- Study literature intended for a French audience

**CHC 2DF – Historie - Semester 2:** the same course as in Social Science – in French

- explores the development of a Canadian identity through major events from 1900 to today, including, World Wars I and II, the depression, prosperity, separation, and the North American reality

# Grade 11 Ext. French

- ▶ **FEF 3U- Semester 1:** develop French language skills through the study of Canadian authors
- ▶ produce a variety of written formats, including a formal essay
  
- ▶ **HRT 3MF – Les Grandes Religions – Semester 2:** the same course as in the Religion department – in French
  - Study of the world religions, including Christianity, Islam, Hinduism, Buddhism, Native spirituality

# Grade 12 Ext. French

**FEF 4U** – only one course for the year:

- Use of Canadian and international authors
- written assignments in a variety of genres
- Research for a written and oral presentation
