





  - ▶ Cost is \$120 (\$40 for each additional choice)
  - ▶ Access PIN required (please see Ms. Wasiuk to pick up your confidential PIN – PIN's must be signed for and will not be given to friends etc.)

- ▶ Ensure **ALL** grad requirements are fulfilled including compulsory and elective courses


