In a school community, virtue formation contributes to a healthy positive learning environment by fostering a climate in which all members feel safe, confident and hope-filled about themselves, their relationships and their future.

ATTENDANCE & PUNCTUALITY

All students are expected to attend school regularly and punctually. In the event that your child will be late or absent, please telephone the school before 8:45 a.m. to inform us of the absence. The answering machine is available from 4:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m.

All students who arrive after 8:45 a.m. or 12:45 p.m. must obtain a late slip from the office. This measure is to ensure the safety of your child.

STUDENT AGENDAS

Premier School Agendas have been ordered for students in grades JK to 8. **We thank our School Council who has covered the cost of the agendas for the school year.**

Student agendas are a planning system that helps students develop organizational skills, time management and responsibility for homework completion. Parents/guardians are encouraged to review the content of the agenda with their child(ren) and to follow-up daily to support the development of positive work habits.

SKATING

Every winter, the students from Grades 1 to 8 have an opportunity to go skating at Vic Johnson Arena. For the safety of all children this year, **it will be mandatory that all students wear helmets.**

ENROLMENT

Please remember that our class lists are tentative for the first two weeks of school. Changes may occur due to growth and/or transfers. Should reorganization be necessary, please be assured that the needs of each student will be taken into consideration. Reorganization will take place on the first PA Day on September 18th.

INFORMATION UPDATE & STUDENT VERIFICATION SHEETS

Please keep us informed of **any** changes to home, work or emergency contact phone numbers. In the unfortunate event that your child is ill or injured, we must be able to contact a parent and/or babysitter immediately. It is important to keep this information current.

A student data form has been sent home with every student. Please fill in any missing information (i.e. student health card number), update phone numbers/correct any errors and sign where indicated. Please return this form to your child's teacher as soon as possible. This information is confidential and is used solely for school purposes.

LUNCH STUDENTS

Please be reminded that the lunch hour is 11:45 a.m. to 12:45 p.m. If possible, students are encouraged to go home for lunch as a break in the school day is a healthy practice. Where children stay for lunch they will eat with their classmates and remain on school property throughout the lunch period. Supervision is provided by staff and a lunch supervisor.

Our school practice is that pupils who regularly remain for lunch are not allowed to leave school property to have lunch at nearby restaurants unless accompanied by the parent. Please help us care for your children and do not send notes to give permission for local food outlets.

If a lunch is delivered for your child, there will be a table set up in our front lobby for students to pick up their lunch. Please ensure that the lunch is clearly labelled with the student's and teacher's name.

PICK-UP AND DROP OFF POLICY

To ensure school security for students and teachers, the Board policy requires that **all visitors (including parents) must report to the office.** Parents or designated individuals are required to sign children in at the office when bringing them to school late and must also sign them out at the office when withdrawing them from school before regular dismissal time.

In our continuing concern for the safety of our students, we would like to minimize the amount of traffic in all hallways at arrival and dismissal times. **Please wait for your children outside their designated exit.** Teachers will continue to meet and escort students to and from these doors at all times. These procedures help to ensure the safety of the students. Thank you for your co-operation.

MEDICATIONS

Please be advised that there is a Board policy on the storage and administration of medication. If your child requires daily administration of medication, please contact the Office as soon as possible.

PEANUT AND NUT ALLERGIES

In our school, we have a number of students with a severe allergy to peanuts and peanut products. For those students, small amounts of this allergen may cause an allergic reaction of life threatening proportions.

Due to the severe nature of this allergic reaction, we would ask for your cooperation in monitoring the food that your son or daughter brings to school. Please take the time to read the ingredients on the package. In particular, please avoid bringing snacks or lunches that contain peanuts as well as products that may have traces of nuts.

We ask that as your children celebrate their birthdays or are involved in school celebrations, you do not bring baked items to school. If you choose to do so, please bring the item to the office beforehand. Please note that Tim Horton's products are not peanut free. Other treats such as fruit, packaged treats, pencils or stickers are an alternative.

As well, advise your children to wash their hands often, especially after eating any peanut products, because these allergens can be transmitted from hands to toys, books and other objects. As well, inform them to brush their teeth or rinse their mouth after eating peanut products because even the smell may cause a reaction.

We appreciate that this may cause difficulties for some but we feel that this is outweighed by the potential harm that could be caused to an allergic child. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding in this matter.

PEDICULOSIS

Each school year it is common for outbreaks of pediculosis to occur among school children. The head louse is a harmless pest – a source of annoyance rather than disease. However, the incidence of pediculosis is increasing, and while researchers suggest that the problem occur in cycles – every few years, the reason for the increase is unknown.

The school seeks parents’ conscientious cooperation in routine inspection and where head lice are detected to assure that adequate treatment is administered. The family doctor or pharmacist can recommend appropriate shampoo treatment. Parents are asked to inform the school so that we can minimize the infestation.

In instances where pediculosis is diagnosed at school, parents will be called and requested to keep the child home until appropriate medication has been administered.

TRANSPORTATION

The Dufferin-Peel C.D.S.B. Board provides bus transportation for students according to these guidelines:

Kindergarten & Gr. 1	1.0 km
Grades 2 - 4	1.6 km
Grades 5 - 8	2.0 km

Information regarding bus eligibility was send home last June with the report card. Parents of students who are eligible for transportation will be able to login to the businfo.stopr.ca website and access the specific details of only their child’s transportation arrangements.

Click “student login”

Enter your child’s OEN number, street address number, school and grade (NOTE: OEN number appears on student report card)

Click “login”.

The bus routes and times are also posted inside the school doors. Some delays may occur during the first few weeks in September. Students should be at their stop at least 5 minutes before the designated times. Parents are responsible for ensuring that their child gets to and from the bus stop safely.

A reminder to please pay special attention to school buses with activated lights and extended stop arm. These signs mean **STOP** and children’s lives are at stake. Please be aware of the law and protect our children.

Students who are on the bus list are expected to take the bus to and from school on a daily basis. Please contact the office if you are picking up a child who normally takes the bus home. This will avoid unnecessary delay to the bus’ departure from our school.

KISS ‘N RIDE

To ease the congestion and provide a safe environment for all of our students, parents/guardians who drive their child to school are asked to use our **Kiss & Ride Program**.

Lane 1, closest to the school building is the **Bus Lane**.

Lane 2, the middle lane is the lane that parents/guardians use to **Drop Off** their child. Drivers are asked to stop beside the parent volunteer at the north end of the parking lot by the stop cone. Students should exit from the passenger side of the vehicle only. The vehicle door will be opened from the outside by a parent volunteer. Students should proceed directly to the school playground.

Lane 3, closest to the street is a **Drive Through** lane to be used only by teachers and visitors parking their vehicles.

If you wish to park and walk your child to the playground entrance, please park your car in the Municipal Lot across the street.

Thank you to all the parents who volunteer their time for the Kiss & Ride program. Your assistance is appreciated.

PARENTS/VISITORS TO THE SCHOOL

All visitors, including parents, must report to the office upon entering school property. No parent/visitor should be on the playground area.

DOGS IN THE SCHOOL YARD

Please refrain from bringing your dogs onto school property. Some children are very frightened of dogs and even the best behaved dogs may react unexpectedly when confronted by large numbers of children.

NO CHILD WITHOUT

Our school is involved in the Canadian MedicAlert Foundation's *No Child Without* program. There is not cost for students who attend our school and are between the ages of 4 up to their 14th birthday to join MedicAlert through this program. If your child has a medical condition, allergy or is required to take medication on a regular basis, then you should consider this program. A child's MediAlert identification can alert school staff, friends, coaches and others about your child's medical condition should an emergency occur.

We will be holding our second annual Terry Fox Walk/Run on Thursday, September 30th. All students from grades 1 to 8 will be participating in a half hour walk/run in order to support cancer research. We are asking that each student bring in a "Toonie for Terry". Please support our students in this worthwhile cause!

HOW PARENTS CAN HELP STUDENTS

- Talk with student about their studies, their homework and their school activities
- Listen when they talk
- Read together and set family reading times
- Limit TV/computer time. Watch TV with them and discuss what is viewed
- Encourage any type of writing (shopping lists, thank you notes, recipes, journals, short stories, letters...)
- Visit the library regularly. Help your child select books
- Check homework assignments and agendas
- Ask them to explain how he/she solves daily life problems
- Show them how to use what they are learning at school in everyday situations
- Request and attend student-teacher-parent conferences. Find out how they are achieving and how they can improve
- Encourage them to do their best and to set personal goals
- Recognize successes and show positive support

KEY ISSUES RELATED TO CATHOLIC EDUCATION

The history of Catholic schools in Ontario since 1841 is one of dedication and perseverance in the face of financial hardship and adversity. STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE

As required by the Education Act and the Ministry of Education, the Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board annually provides parents with information about cost-effective student accident insurance coverage via student courier. Although enrolment is voluntary, the board encourages parents to take advantage of the inexpensive insurance coverage, especially if their child/children participate in sports, excursions/field trips, or, if parents do not have dental insurance coverage.

Enrolment is required in writing so there are two options for enrolment:

- 1) Complete the traditional form and mail it in or**
- 2) Photocopy the form and fax it to Reliable Life at 1-905-522-7211 or 1-800-463-KIDS (5437).**

Parents alone have the right to insure their children.

SCHOOL POLICY ON THE USE OF PERSONAL ELECTRONIC DEVICES by Students on School Property

To promote respect for the dignity of all members of our school community and to enhance student achievement and safety, the use of a PED is strictly prohibited in the school (including portables) or during school related activities (such as retreats, field trips, sports events, etc.)

Failure to comply with this policy may result in the confiscation of the PED and/or disciplinary action as outlined in the Catholic Code of Conduct 2001. The school and the Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board assume no responsibility for the loss, recovery repair or replacement for and PED brought onto school property.

It is the policy of the Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board that PEDs are to be kept out-of-sight, turned off and not used within school premises or during school sanctioned events. To prevent the loss or damage of PEDs, the school encourages students to leave their PEDs at home.
