LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

We begin by acknowledging the land and our responsibility to care for and respect all that Creation gives to provide us with life. 

Online Learning

- Students must earn two (2) e-Learning credits to graduate from secondary school
- Courses are asynchronous (no live teaching)
- Can Opt Out
- On MyBlueprint
- All Grade 11 and 12 students are E-learning eligible

The form asks parents/guardians to choose to opt their child out of the mandatory e-learning courses required for graduation. It includes a section for parents/guardians of students under 18 years of age, a section for students who are at least 18 years of age or are 16 or 17 years of age and have withdrawn from parental consent, and a section for students who are at least 18 years of age and have withdrawn from parental consent. The form also includes a section for students who are at least 18 years of age and have withdrawn from parental consent. The form is dated from April 2021 to June 2022 and may be revised towards the graduation requirements, in recognition of the extraordinary circumstances of the COVID-19 pandemic.
