## LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

We begin by acknowledging the land and our responsibility to care for and respect all that Creation gives to provide us with life. 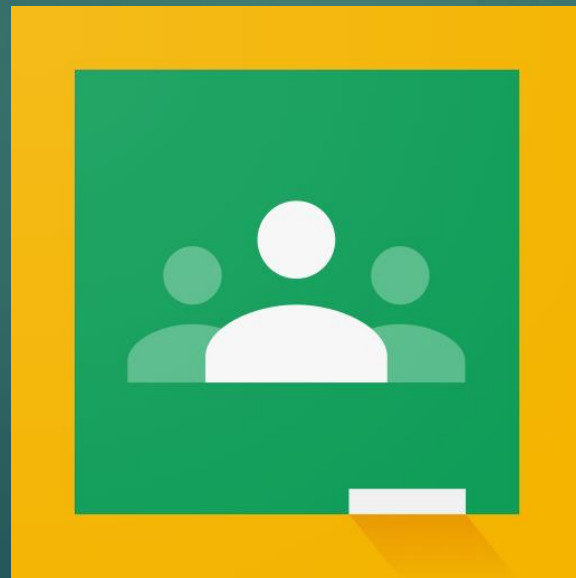

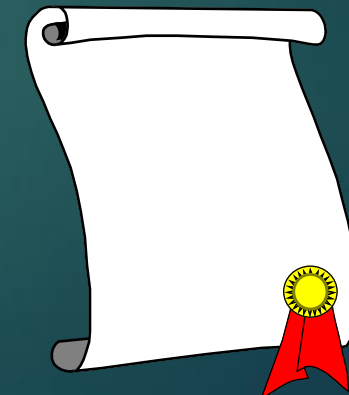
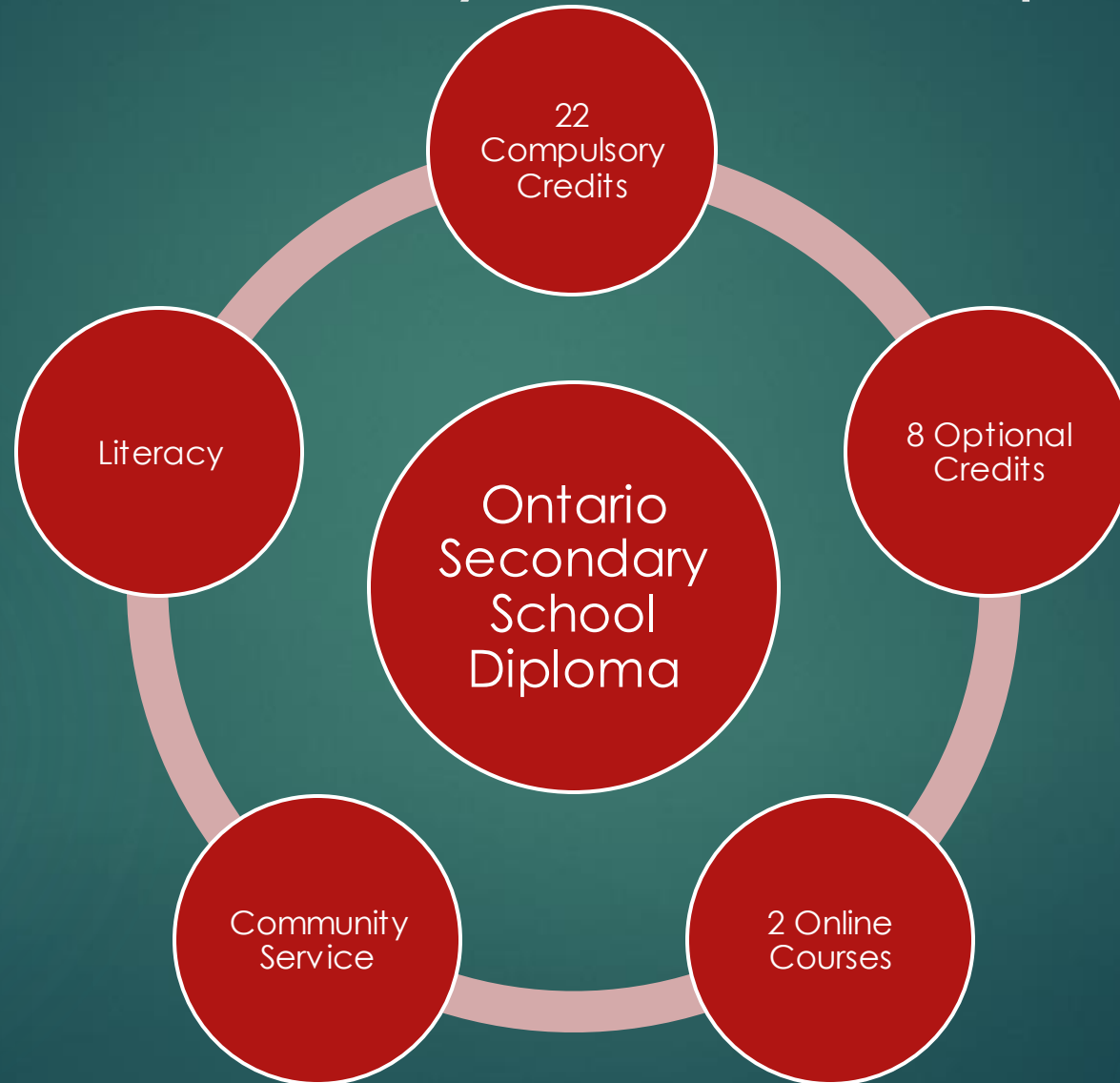

- Admission is based on 6 'U' and/or 'M' Grade 12 courses.
- Admission averages vary depending on programs.
- Access University Viewbooks and attend University Presentations.
- Application to Universities are due mid-January!!

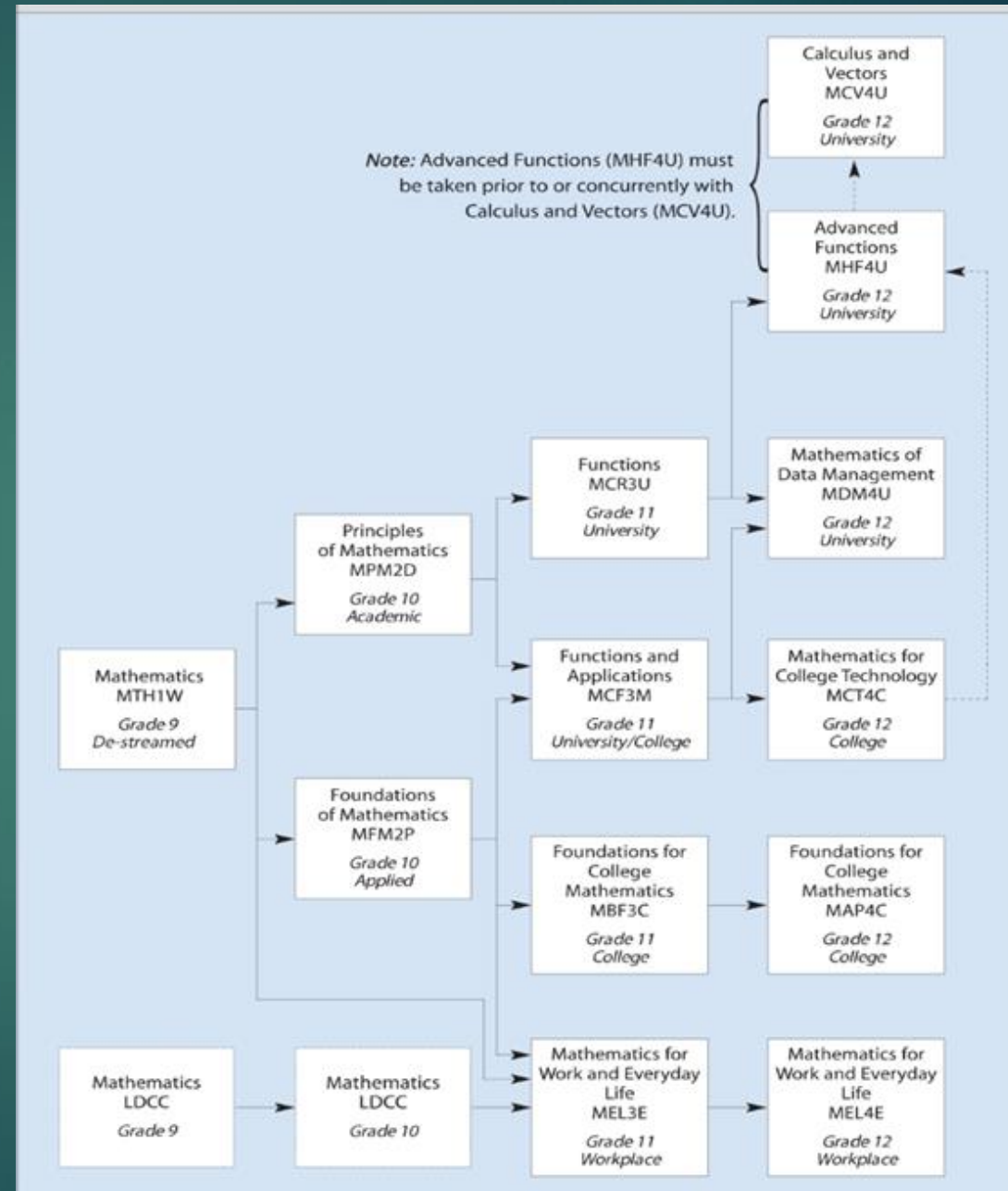
Check **pre-requisites** to Post-Secondary



# Online Learning

- Students must earn two (2) e-Learning credits to graduate from secondary school
- Courses are asynchronous (no live teaching)
- Can Opt Out
- On MyBlueprint
- All Grade 11 and 12 students are E-learning eligible

There is also a section for students who are at least 18 years of age, where they can confirm that they have read the form and agree to the terms. The form includes fields for the student's name, the parent/guardian's signature, and the date.
