Online Learning



- Students must earn two (2) e-Learning credits to graduate from secondary school
- Courses are asynchronous (no live teaching)

A document titled "Opt-Out Form for eLearning Graduation Requirements" from the Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board. The form is addressed to "Dear Parent/Guardian:" and explains that the Ministry of Education, through EDC/1367, has mandated that students must earn two (2) e-learning credits to graduate from secondary school beginning with every student who entered Grade 9 in the 2020-2021 school year. It states that e-learning courses are Grades 9 to 12 credit courses that are delivered entirely using the internet and do not require students to be physically present with one another or with their educator, except where they may be needed for examinations and other final evaluations and other school-based supports. Parents/guardians may choose to opt their child out of the mandatory e-learning courses required for graduation. The form is included as part of the annual course selection process for all Catholic secondary school students. It must be returned to the student's school and will be included in the student's OAS (Ontario Student Record). The form does not need to be returned to the school if your child is choosing to fulfil the two-credit e-learning course requirement. A section for parents/guardians of students under 18 years of age includes a checkbox and a signature line. A section for students who are at least 18 years of age, or are 16 or 17 years of age and have withdrawn from parental consent, includes a checkbox and a signature line. A note at the bottom states that the form was completed by students who were in Grade 9 during the province-wide school closure from April 2020 to June 2021, and may be covered towards the graduation requirement, in recognition of the extraordinary circumstances of the COVID-19 pandemic.

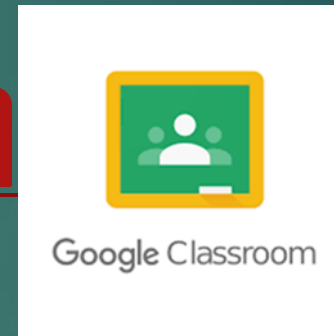
