What do I need to graduate?

18 compulsory credits:

- 4 credits in English
- 3 credits in Mathematics
- 2 credits in Science
- 1 credit in Canadian History
- 1 credit in Canadian Geography
- 1 credit in the Arts
- 1 credit in Health and Physical Education
- 1 credit in French as a second language
- 0.5 credit in Career Studies
- 0.5 credit in Civics

Plus one credit from each of the following groups:

- 1 additional credit in English, or a third language, or social sciences and the humanities, or Canadian and world studies, or guidance and career education, or cooperative education
- 1 additional credit in health and physical education, or the arts, or business studies, or cooperative education, or French
- 1 additional credit in science, or technological education, or cooperative education, or French, or computer studies

In addition to the compulsory credits, students must complete:

- 12 optional credits
- 40 hours of community involvement activities
- The Provincial literacy requirement
