Throughout Catholic Education Week, we ask you to reflect on the significance of Catholic education's presence and contribution in our Church, and in our society.

The sub-themes for Catholic Education Week 2024 are:

- Thursday: **As people of justice / Dans la justice**
- Friday: **As people of joy / Dans la joie**

A variety of activities will be held during Catholic Education Week that highlight our students bringing their faith into action. Our Crowning of Mary Celebration, praying of the Rosary, and Celebration of Mass will bring our students and community together not only in prayer and reflection but also to our commitment to our own relationship with Christ.

Faith Formation:

Forming ourselves in our Catholic faith is a foundational element in helping each of us understand and live in the example of Christ.

As a school community, we begin each day with morning prayer that centers on scripture. Scripture readings are explained in student friendly language and reflect upon a variety of ways that not only integrate the curriculum but are presented so that students can relate and make a connection to their own lives.

School wide masses are celebrated at St. Dominic's Parish in person with students from Queen of Heaven and St. Paul's Secondary School.

Every Wednesday, one of our classes and one class from Queen of Heaven will celebrate mass at St. Dominic's Parish. This is an opportunity for students to participate in the traditions and customs of a Catholic Mass. It will also help students strengthen their own relationship with Jesus.

Grade 2 and Grade 7 students will prepare for the sacraments of Reconciliation, Communion and Confirmation respectively this year. The school and parish will work in collaboration to prepare our students through Catechism classes and retreats.

Our Youth Faith Ambassadors and school leaders at St. Dominic School will plan, organize and assist in food drives, gift card drives, Christmas outreach initiatives, eco-friendly and healthy lifestyle initiatives, building a strong sense of school community and putting their faith into action.

All meetings, staff, divisional, school council, IPRC meetings etc. begin with prayer, followed by our land acknowledgement. Liturgies and reflections focus on deepening our faith as educators and followers of Jesus.

Sacramental Preparation:

As Catholics, we understand sacraments to be "outward signs instituted by Christ to give grace." Together in partnership with our parish, we support the preparation of God's children in receiving the sacraments.

Framed by the Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations (OCSGE), our graduates will be effective communicators, reflective thinkers, lifelong learners, collaborative contributors, caring family members, responsible citizens and discerning believers formed in the Catholic faith community.

Showing respect for Ontario Catholic School Graduate expectations (OCSGE) means infusing them into daily activities and curriculum.

Banner outlining the OCSGE are visibly displayed in the front foyer of the school. Grade 8 staff regularly incorporate the OCSGE in lessons and formally recognize students who emulate each of the OCSGE at the graduation ceremony with an award. Through social justice programs, student led liturgies, curriculum links and parent education, we highlight the OCSGEs as the central foundation for all our students.

Celebrating Virtues:

A virtue is a habit or established capacity to perform good actions according to a moral standard. When we practice these virtues, we strengthen them and thereby make the presence of God more and more visible in the world around us.

As a Catholic community, we embed the Virtues program in all that we do spiritually, academically, socially, and physically.

We incorporate Virtues into our daily prayers, lessons, classroom displays, and acknowledge the good actions of our students. Students are provided with examples of stories that display the virtues to assist in teaching, modelling and guiding students in making better decisions.

Our Youth Faith Ambassadors are promoting our virtues by “catching” moments when students display or put their faith into action. We will recognize these virtuous actions on a display board.

Visible Signs of our Faith:

Through symbol and service, we are instruments of God’s love whose work within our communities stands as a witness to our faith.

Symbols of our faith are visible in each classroom and throughout the school. Liturgical cloths, crosses, Bibles, sacred spaces, Advent wreaths, candles and books that speak to our Catholic faith are clearly evident, especially during our virtual liturgies and celebrations.

The display case and entrance to the school welcomes all who enter through our doors and gives a strong message to our visitors that St. Dominic is a Catholic School in word, deed and action. Staff and students are committed to Catholic Education and living out our Faith daily through prayer, reflections and kind acts of charity and compassion.
