

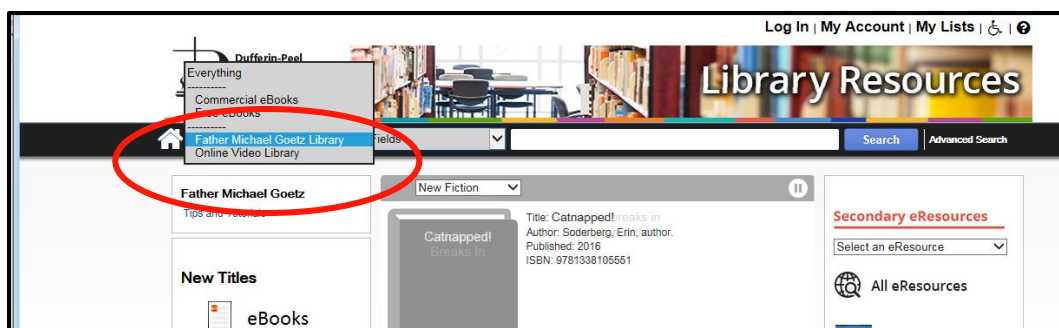

How do I search the library catalogue?

The [FMG Library Catalogue](#) is accessible on the Internet.

The Catalogue is a collection of bibliographic records of our collection. It helps you select and locate an item in the library.

If you are looking for printed materials, you may limit your search to items within Father Michael Goetz SS only, then search by keyword (s), title, author, or series.



You may also access the collection of electronic resources from the Catalogue.
