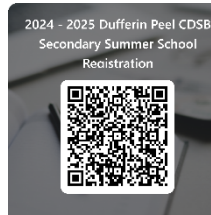
ADULT AND CONTINUING EDUCATION - SECONDARY SUMMER SCHOOL CREDIT COURSES JULY 2025

How to Register

REGISTRATION PROCESS:

All students wishing to take a night school course: Must FULLY complete the [registration request](#) form or the QR code

- Registration requests will be forwarded to their Guidance Counsellor for review and approval
- Registration requests will be processed only after the Guidance Counsellor approval is received
- Deadline for all approved registration forms is **June 11, 2025 @12:00 noon.**
- Students are strongly encouraged to register as soon as possible as limited space is available.



Cancellation of Courses

- Courses run pending enrolment
- Courses will run in person and in some circumstances (low enrollment) courses may be changed to online synchronous course delivery
- Students will receive emails if the course has been cancelled or changed
- Confirmation emails are sent to applicants' email on file
- Students are strongly advised to check their emails for ongoing updates

- ✓ There is no Walk in Registration for Secondary Summer School. We suggest registering for Secondary Summer School as soon as possible.
- ✓ Students Must FULLY complete the registration form located [here](#)
- ✓ Registration forms will be processed only after Guidance Counsellor approval is received.
- ✓ Student Parking is limited at all sites.

ELIGIBLE STUDENTS: Students must be currently enrolled in a Secondary School program for admission to the Secondary Summer School Program, July 2025.

The student must have the required prerequisite (where necessary).

- Students must attend class on the first day of Summer School or may be withdrawn from the course.
- Regular attendance is crucial for success in all credit programs.
- Attendance and punctuality are compulsory.
- Students will be demitted after 3 (three) consecutive absences.
- Students may be demitted following a contravention of the Catholic Code of Conduct.

FINAL ASSESSMENT:

Students must write/complete their final assessment at the end of the program, on the date and time set out by the Adult and Continuing Education Department. **Students who miss the scheduled final assessment will receive a mark of zero for the assessment.**

MEDICAL CONCERNS:

Participants in Adult and Continuing Education Programs must advise the administration and classroom teacher of any major health concerns/conditions/ anaphylactic allergies and ensure an emergency contact number is available.

TEXTBOOKS: A \$100.00 deposit must be submitted on the FIRST DAY OF CLASS. This will be refunded upon the return of an undamaged book. Visa/Mastercard payment slips available *Cheques or Money Order* should be made payable to Dufferin-Peel CDSB. is also accepted.
