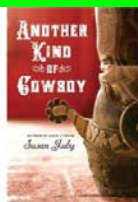

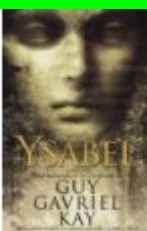
The Space Between by Don Aker
